Adopt4Life's new <u>AFCCA Family Supports Program</u> supports families formed by adoption in strengthening family connections and meeting the needs of their children and youth, with both clinical coordination and peer-based supports and resources for parents and caregivers.

OTTAWA, Sept 2022 - Families formed by adoption, kinship, and customary care with children and youth who have experienced loss and disrupted attachments have been shown to benefit when parents and caregivers are supported with trauma-informed, attachment-focused strategies and resources. Adopt4Life's new <u>AFCCA Family Supports Program</u> builds on the recognized success of its existing provincial Parent2Parent peer support network for parents / caregivers, adding clinical support and coordination for families who adopted children and youth through children's aid societies and are experiencing AFCCA.

According to Canada's <u>National Consortium on Aggression toward Family / Caregivers in Childhood & Adolescence</u>, AFCCA describes a pattern of behaviour in childhood or adolescence, characterized by aggressive behaviour by a child or adolescent toward family members or other caregivers, and resulting in harm to the child/adolescent themselves, the person(s) the behaviour is directed towards, and other family members. AFCCA can occur in families of all kinds, both biological and adoptive.

For families experiencing AFCCA, being part of an understanding peer community can provide immense relief for parents and caregivers; and additional access to a highly skilled clinical team can help to increase family stability. With effective supports, parents/caregivers have shared they feel better equipped to meet the ongoing developmental needs of their children. Adopt4Life's specialized <u>AFCCA Family Supports Program</u>, enabled by funding from Ontario's Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS), provides individualized strategies that include:

- Peer communities and clinical coordination for families with complex needs.
- Clinician-led therapeutic support groups for parents and caregivers.
- On-demand learning, with specialized tools and resources that promote awareness and skill development.
- Exploring strategies that promote and maintain safety for all family members.
- Intensive advocacy and navigation assistance with coordinated community referrals.

Joining Adopt4Life to deliver this innovative new program are recognized Clinical Leads with deep expertise in developmental trauma, attachment, and neurodevelopmental disabilities, along with professional backgrounds in psychotherapy, social work, and mental health.
